# Easter GREETING

Dear Beloved SPC Family:

Grace and peace to you in this holy season of Easter! Easter is a powerful celebration of hope, renewal, and the triumph of life over darkness, centered on the resurrection of Jesus Christ. **Saint Peter Claver Parish Welcomes New Pastor** BY NITA CLARKE

Father Damian Anumba, MSSCC, stepped upon the altar at St. Peter Claver Parish and was welcomed as the new pastor during the weekend of July 12 and 13, 2025. The steady sound of African drums set the pace of the procession of the mass while the gospel choir raised their voices in singing *In the Name of Jesus*.

“God is good” Father Damian said to begin his homily.

“All the time”, the assembly responded.

“And all the time”, he continued.

“God is good”! the assembly repeated the familiar greeting of Father Norman Fischer whose untimely death in July of 2024 led to this moment.

“He eludes warmth and sincerity,” Michelle Yeasayer, Transplant Coordinator and Physician Assistant of the Veterans Administration Hospital said. “His message was clear and heartfelt. I thoroughly enjoyed the mass and truly believe that Father Damian is a wonderful fit for our parish.”

Beth Ross, retired respiratory therapist at St. Joseph hospital, stated that “I think we all took a deep breath and knew that God had sent us a very spirit filled priest to lead us.”

“The teaching was definitely a revelation to me!” Said Dr. Melissa Leverette, specializing in nutrition and chiropractic care. “I had never considered the definition of what Jesus means by ‘neighbor’ but Fr. Damian explained it thoroughly.”

Associate Professor of History and African-American and Africana Studies, Hilary Jones stated that there were tears, “tears for sure but I also sensed that the congregation felt relief and joy!”

Originally from Nigeria in West Africa, Fr. Damian is the fourth child of six siblings. He was educated from elementary school through seminary in Nigeria and was ordained a priest under the religious congregation of the Missionaries of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary.

In 2017, Fr. Damian came to the United States and was assigned to his community in Linwood, New Jersey.

“It was really exciting and inspiring to work with people of various cultures and ideologies in New Jersey. After two years in New Jersey, through the request and help of Bishop John Stowe, I came to the Diocese of Lexington in 2019 and was assigned as a parochial vicar at the Cathedral of Christ the King where I was able to study Clinical Pastoral Education, CPE, at the University of Kentucky.”

In 2021, Fr. Damian was assigned by Bishop John to be the pastor of Sacred Heart Church in Corbin.

“I served there until the end of June, 2025. My experience in Corbin was awesome and amazing! The people were so good and supportive to my pastoral ministry. And now I feel so blessed and honored to be at St. Peter Claver as the pastor. It has been beautifully amazing so far.”

Fr. Damian stated that he enjoys table tennis (ping pong), basketball and tennis.

“I also enjoy reading philosophical books and good novels.” He continued. “I enjoy hiking, fishing and traveling, meeting new people, experiencing new cultures and the adventures that God has in store for me.”
